Did you know?



Views from Taconic and Green—School District

Three, Two, One ... Liftoff! Thursday, September 13, 2018

The most difficult part of a three-

stage rocket launch is getting the ship off the ground. There's always some initial shuddering as the rocket lifts slowly, but soon it's up and away smoothly on its flight.

A space launch reminds me a lot of a new school year. A great deal of work goes into getting the buildings ready, schedules set, transportation routes finalized, new teachers oriented, students registered, schools assigned, and curriculum plans set. Then come the human adjustments - everyone finding themselves and their place in new classrooms.

This year features an extra dimension. It's the first year of the new Taconic & Green and Mettawee Community School districts. While most students continue to attend their local community schools, there were some subtle changes being fine tuned.

Transportation comes immediately to mind. For the first time, bus routes for the six schools of the Taconic and Green and Mettawee School Districts were coordinated by the BRSU. Most journeys remained the same, but we now have the added responsibility of transporting Taconic and Green students from nine communities taking advantage of in-District school choice for 7th and 8th grade. Another change was the addition of secondary school routes in Manchester. We're now into the second full week and most issues have been addressed. Some of our BRSU staff will be riding buses this week to make sure all is as it should be.

A coordinated approach to our food services was another adjustment fueled by the merger of the Taconic and Green. The chefs from all our schools have been relieved of paperwork tasks and given more time to cook from scratch in the kitchens. Recipes now include more fresh ingredients, including local meats, fruits and vegetables. In addition, detailed, descriptive menus are available online on your school websites.

And when you go to your school website, you'll find a new look on the home page. Over the summer we have made the transition to a new website hosted by Google with a customized student information database called Alma. Our goal was to find a more user friendly interface for parents, students and teachers. The new sites for all schools will be up and running this week. Parents should be on the lookout for information sent home in the next few weeks with instructions for how to sign in to your Alma account. You will see the Alma icon displayed prominently on the home page for each school. Alma will offer the latest information on homework assignments, attendance, report cards, and easy online access to your child's teacher.

So we're off the ground with transportation, food services and websites. We'll continue to monitor and make adjustments when necessary, but all in all, it's been a great launch here at Mission Control.

Dorset Fire District: Water System Update

The Dorset Fire District recently received source testing approval for the supplemental water source (a drilled bedrock well) off Cheney Road. The water quality has met all Vermont Drinking Water primary health standards. Engineers are currently working through simple filtration testing and design for sediment. The current goal is to move forward with source evaluation and connection design this fall and winter. Construction and connection would then take place in the spring of 2019. Other items of note:

- The metering station has been brought online. This will help the District better understand water consumption and calculate percentage of water lost to leaks.
- As part of an asset management grant, the District received some preliminary engineering with regard to upgrading multi user service lines on Route 30 North and Dorset West Road North. These areas are serviced by long (2,500'+ on Route 30) old galvanized service lines. There are have been at least 6 leak repairs in these areas of the past few years.




