In the fall of 2012 the Dorset Highway Department removed an old stone retaining wall and a few trees, the beach area was made larger and the grassy seating area was also enlarged for visitors.

Emerald Lake offers day use activities like swimming, fishing, kayaking, paddle boating, hiking. Camping is also a popular weekend attraction at Emerald Lake. The Park is home to a wide array of camping & lean-to sites for visitors.

The typical rule of thumb is that any alterations to the exterior of the building requires a permit & any structure costing more than \$1,000 to build requires a permit.

CLYBORNE PARK

August 15 to August 31

Winner of the 2011 Pulitzer Prize and London's Olivier Award for Best Play, *Clybourne Park* is a wickedly funny and fiercely provocative new play about the volatile combination of race and real estate. Act One opens in 1959, as a white couple sells their home to a black family (the Younger family in *A Raisin In the Sun*), causing an uproar in their middle-class neighborhood; Act Two finds the same house, in 2009, changing hands again. While the stakes have changed over the years, the debate remains strikingly similar as neighbors wage a hilarious and horrifying pitched battle over territory and legacy that reveals just how far our ideas about race and gentrification have evolved—or, have they?





Kelly Road Project

This past winter the Town of Dorset reached an agreement with Richard & Kirsten McDonough, owner's of the Dorset Quarry. This agreement involved a boundary line adjustment that saw the Town discontinue and quit claim the southern portion of Kelly Road to the McDonough's. In exchange the McDonough's gave the Town about 0.23 acres of land in the area of northern Kelly Road. The Town was then able to alter northern Kelly Road to became a connector between Route 30 and Black Rock Lane.

The purpose of this project? Visitors to the Dorset Quarry will now have access to a separate parking area, that is not connected to Black Rock Lane. This affords Black Rock Lane residents dedicated personal and emergency services access to their homes. This project will create a safer situation for residents and visitors to the area near the Quarry.

Parking is now strictly prohibited on Kelly Road, Black Rock Lane & Route 30 near the Dorset Quarry. Those who park illegally will be subject to immediate towing at the owner's expense, and subject to fines of up to \$500. Don't park in this area....its not worth it.

Many thanks to Richard & Kirsten McDonough for their commitment to work with the Town on coming up with a solution to this age old question, and enhancing the safety and aesthetics of the area in the process.
